Dog on GWIC* Greyhound Racing Register

FOR DOGS ACTIVELY RACING

Minister's recent Announcement – e-tracking of racing greyhounds, ie before retirement

Dog not on any register unless new owner registers on NSW Pet Registry – local council resources are

insufficient to

enforce

GREYHOUND RETIRES

A dog may be retired because it is not suitable for racing, is injured, or reaches the end of its racing life.



DENIED REHOMING

Euthanased after being classified as behaviourally unsuitable or rejected by industry adoption program. GWIC can track if notified of intended euthanasia.

NO PROOF OF LIFE REQUIRED FROM THIS POINT ON

KEPT BY OWNER OR TRAINER

GWIC estimates 42% of greyhounds retiring in FY19/20 fall in this category, but is unable to obtain proof of life due to lack of resources. E-readers will only help if these dogs are taken to a vet.

UNTRACKED REHOMING

GWIC estimates 18% of greyhounds retiring in FY19/20 are given to a third party by owners and trainers and no longer tracked eg free dogs offered on Gumtree.

POSSIBLE OUTCOMES FOR UNTRACKED GREYHOUNDS



Dissected

Used as training tools at universities and medical schools.

Continues today



Mass killing

Discarded by the industry or owner on retirement and subsequently killed.

McHugh inquiry in 2016 estimated 68,500 dogs killed in past 12 years

Continues today



Vivisected

Experimented on by researchers and then discarded.

Continues today



Drained of blood

Killed after being drained of blood at vet surgeries. Greyhounds are universal donors.
