

Our farewell to Dennis, 5 December 2021

The CPG team is mourning the loss of Dennis Anderson. Dennis joined CPG as Vice President in 2018 and took on the role of President in 2019 replacing Dr Eleonora Gullone, the founder of CPG.

As with many greyhound advocates and activists, Dennis became involved after investigating the story of his beloved rescue greyhound Comet. As he mentioned in an article he wrote for CPG's Greyhound Life Matters in 2019, his research into Comet's history revealed an industry guilty of "corruption and criminality on an industrial scale". His horror was compounded when he discovered that Comet's sire, Lochinvar Marlow, was exported to the Canidrome hellhole in Macau where he died. Dennis vowed that he would "do my best as long as I can to save these wonderful dogs." And he certainly did.

Dennis brought a wealth of experience to his role as President including management, diplomatic, research, and analytical skills developed during his many years in the air force. During his time with CPG he became a trusted and respected media spokesperson, appeared before parliamentary commissions and spoke compellingly at greyhound protests. Dennis had just the right sort of leadership qualities for a passionate team of animal advocates, he was kind, courteous, fearless and funny.

At heart Dennis was all about collaboration. CPG continued to grow under his leadership, both within the team and in the way we partnered with other groups to achieve our aims. He worked with greyhound rescues and welfare groups including Animal Liberation, GREY2KUSA, Let Greyhounds Run Free, Free the Hounds, and engaged with politicians across the spectrum.

Dennis was passionately committed to banning greyhound racing and protecting greyhound lives until that happens.

CPG will continue his fight until there is no greyhound racing industry in Australia.

Our thoughts are with his family and friends and we send them our deepest condolences.











Select Committee on the Greyhound Welfare and Integrity Commission where Dennis was due to appear on 6 December 2021


Farewell to my colleague and friend, Dennis. Not only have the greyhounds lost a strong and passionate advocate, but the world has lost a kind and compassionate soul.

It was a true privilege to be replaced as president of the CPG by Dennis. From the very first conversation I had with him, it was clear that he was a no nonsense guy with a giant heart. Having recently retired, he had become aware of the cruelty and corruption within the greyhound racing industry.

He wasted no time in leaping to action. He was not involved with the CPG very long when I asked him to take the top job. He did not hesitate. I knew that the industry would not know what was about to hit it. It was not long before he was making detailed submissions, fronting the media, organizing rallies, and meeting top officials in the industry as well as Members of Parliament.

It is a major tragedy that his life was cut short so quickly. I was informed in December that Dennis was gravely ill and that he would not see Christmas. That was indeed what came to pass. Poor Comet has lost his best friend and protector and so have all of the greyhounds who continue to be exploited by this blatantly exploitative and cruel industry – in relation to dogs and humans alike (with Australia leading the world in gambling addiction).





But for those spiritually minded among us, I believe that Dennis, having crossed the rainbow bridge and having become united with the hundreds of thousands of greyhound spirits exploited by the industry, will continue his mission to end the industry. Indeed, he will do so perhaps even more powerfully now than when in human form.

Rest quietly and feel his energy. I'm sure the greyhounds can.
